ANOTHER AMENDMENT TO THE CONSTITUTION

We thought when we adopted the new Constitution in 1969 that we were all set for years to come.

Now we find it necessary to amend it to permit an increase in dues, as announced in the April bulletin.

It also develops that, although we provided for filling a vacancy existing in the office of President, we did not specify who was to take charge of filling the vacancy.

We now wish to amend Article X, section b, to read as follows: In case of a vacancy in the office of President, the Secretary shall take temporary charge of the organization and shall notify the other officers that a vacancy exists. The officers shall elect one of their number to serve as President Pro Tempore until the time of the next Annual Meeting.

This statement constitutes the official notice to the membership of intention to amend the Constitution, as required by Article XIII, section b.
